Michelle Bachelet was a victim of human rights violation during Chile's right wing dictatorship. She has since served as the first woman President of Chile, and the first head of UN Women in 2010.

In addition, the organization works on its other pillars of Protection of Cultural Heritage, Peace and Interfaith Dialogue, Women and Girl Empowerment and Youth Leadership.
