Since protests began in mid-February civilians have been subjected to disproportionate violence from government forces. Hundreds of protestors have been killed and many areas lack food, clean water, and medical supplies.

President Kader insisted that Libyan leader Muammar Qaddafi follow the demands of the United Nations and the international community to cease all violence against his citizens.

She added: "The Libyan people have the right to protest peacefully without suffering atrocious violence from their government. They have the right as human beings to freedom of speech, dignity, peace and security."

The USFMEP prays for a peaceful resolution to the conflict, and supports the people of Libya in their demands for Human Rights and freedom.
